ABOUT

Rebuild Texas Fund

The Rebuild Texas Fund was launched by the Michael & Susan Dell Foundation and OneStar Foundation just 4 days after Hurricane Harvey devastated Texas communities. The Fund is dedicated to the economic recovery of hard-hit Texas communities. So far, the Fund has:

- Raised **\$94.6 million** from more than 32,000 donors, 100% of which will be deployed in communities
- Invested over **\$36.6 million** in 95 projects to rebuild and revitalize communities
- Funded projects across all five regions (as defined by the Governor's Commission to Rebuild Texas) and across all six program areas, including \$14.8 million to projects serving all five regions

The Rebuild Texas Fund team is dedicated to supporting and accelerating community efforts by being:

- **Community-led:** Engaging with community members directly impacted by the storm to learn their priorities and needs
- **Collaborative:** Joining forces with local leaders and organizations to address community priorities, pool resources, and foster strong and productive working relationships
- **On-the-Ground:** Logging tens of thousands of miles so far to spend time in communities and deeply understand their opportunities and challenges
