## ABOUT

### Rebuild Texas Fund

The Rebuild Texas Fund was launched by Michael and Susan Dell and Governor Greg Abbott just days after Hurricane Harvey devastated Texas communities. A collaborative project of the Michael & Susan Dell Foundation and the OneStar Foundation, the Fund is dedicated to the economic recovery of hard-hit Texas communities. So far, the Fund has:

- Raised **\$93.1 million** from more than 32,000 donors, 100% of which will be deployed in communities
- Invested over **\$18 million** in 64 projects to rebuild and revitalize communities
- Funded projects across all five regions (as defined by the Governor's Commission to Rebuild Texas) and across all six program areas

The Rebuild Texas Fund team is dedicated to supporting and accelerating community efforts by being:

- **Community-led:** Engaging with community members directly impacted by the storm to learn their priorities and needs
- **Collaborative:** Joining forces with local leaders and organizations to address community priorities, pool resources, and foster strong and productive working relationships
- **On the Ground:** Logging almost 20,000 miles so far to spend time in communities and deeply understand the opportunities and challenges
